Tickets with accreditation

You need individual tickets for all programmes and both cinemas. You can book or reserve your tickets online with your accreditation on our **programme & ticket shop**

To book your ticket via accreditation you need to:

- 1. log in to your account
- 2. **choose** per click **the programme** you want to watch on the detailed "programme overview"
- 3. choose the O€ ticket.

Once you did, you will receive a confirmation email with additional information. The ticket will be accessible via the QR code on your festival badge.


Alternatively, you can still get tickets at the box office by showing your festival badge. We recommend early booking, especially for evening and weekend screenings.

Please **buy your tickets online** if possible and have your **QR code ready for admission**. Admission and entrance will be controlled by the cinema staff.

Who's at the festival?

You want to know who is at the festival? In our guest office you will find a photo wall with all accredited persons (as far as they have deposited a photo). You can also view the <u>delegates list</u> via your Filmchief account. Via the delegates list you have the possibility to contact the filmmakers via email.

Video Library

During the festival, access to the current titles and contact details of all films from the festival is reserved exclusively on site for professional audiences, especially those interested in acquisitions and other festivals. Appointments can only be made via the booking tool.

After the Festival, competition entries will be made available online to accredited professionals, password protected, for individual viewing purposes in the online Video Library from 1 May – 31 May 2023.

You have the opportunity to watch our award-winning films online for free. All you have to do is <u>register</u> with your name and e-mail address and you will receive a code that will allow you to watch the programme for 24 hours from 22.00 on 1 May.

Need a little time out?

We have put together an extensive programme that is really worth seeing. Nevertheless, you need a little time out now and then. For example, with a short bike tour towards the Kaisergarten and the castle (after which the city was named). There, you can sit by the canal and watch the ships go by, or you can ride over the bridge sculpture "Slinky Springs to Fame" by Tobias Rehberger. Further along the canal you will discover, among other things, the Gasometer (a former gas tank that has been converted into Europe's tallest exhibition and event hall) and the dancing electricity pylon at the Ripshorst hayloft garden.

Our cinemas

Lichtburg means light castle, which is – in our opinion – one of the most beautiful names for a cinema. Built back in 1931, it's a real film palace and a great place to show our films. The Walzenlagerkino got its name from the fact that the rollers for the zinc sheets were stored there in the former zinc factory. Also a real piece of the city's history.

Travel plan

>>> From Düsseldorf Airport to Oberhausen Central Station

To get to the train station "Düsseldorf Flughafen" after arriving at the airport, you first have to take the SkyTrain (daily 3:45 am to 0:45 am, every 5 to 7 minutes). Accepted as a ticket for the SkyTrain are:

- valid VRR and VRS tickets
- special DB tickets (City plus, NRW ticket, etc.)
- parking tickets issued by Flughafen Düsseldorf GmbH (valid for up to nine people)
- Tickets for the airport terrace, on the day of redemption
- Rail&Fly tickets

All passengers who do not have one of these tickets must purchase a ticket to "Oberhausen Hbf" at the short-haul fare ("Kurzstrecke") before travelling. Tickets can be purchased via the vending machines at the SkyTrain stations at the airport as well as via the Deutsche Bahn website (bahn.de/en), via the VRR and DB app.

From the station you can now take the trains of the lines **RE3 (to Hamm)**, **RE5 (to Oberhausen)** or **RE19 (to Arnhem)** to the station "**Oberhausen Hbf**" (Mainstation) with the ticket you bought before.

>>> From Oberhausen main station to Düsseldorf airportStation

From the train station you can take the trains of the lines RE3 (to Düsseldorf Hbf), RE5 (to Koblenz Hbf) or RE19 (to Düsseldorf Hbf) with the ticket you bought before at the station "Oberhausen Hbf".

>>> From Oberhausen main station to Hotel MeliáStation

To get to the Hotel Meliá, you have to take the buses of the lines 960 (to Holten Bf.), 961 (to Oberhausen Spechtstr.) or 957 (to OB Sterkrade Bf.) or the streetcars of the lines 112 (to Oberhausen Neumarkt), SB92 and SB98 (to Falkestr.), SB91 (to GE Buer Rathaus) or SB90 (to OB Holten Markt) at the main station in Oberhausen. The stop in the immediate vicinity of the hotel is called "Neue Mitte". From there it is only a few minutes walk to the hotel. The exact departure points at the main station can be seen in the figure below.

The night buses of the lines NE1 (to Oberhausen Hirschkamp), NE2 (to OB Heinr. Böll GS), NE6 (to OB Sterkrade BF.), NE11 (to Essen Hbf) or NE21 (to BOT ZOB Berliner Platz) also stop at "Neue Mitte".

Tickets can be purchased for individual short trips (1.90 euros) or a 24-hour ticket (7.60 euros), which entitles the holder to any number of trips within the area of validity. Tickets can be purchased via the Deutsche Bahn website (bahn.de/en), via the VRR and DB app, at ticket machines, at the KundenCenter Hauptbahnhof and Neue Mitte, as well as on buses and streetcars.

>>> From Hotel Meliá to LichtburgStation

The above connections can also be used in the opposite direction to get to the cinema. From the main station, the Lichtburg can be reached on foot in 5 minutes.

>>> From Oberhausen main station to Hotel Super 8

To get to the Hotel Super 8 you have to take the bus lines 957 (to OB Sterkrade Bf.) or 961 (to Oberhausen Speckstr.) at the main station in Oberhausen to get to the bus stop "Elektrostahlwerk". From there it is only a few minutes walk to the hotel. The "Neue Mitte" stop can also be reached with the above-mentioned connections. From there it would be a 15-minute walk to the hotel.

Tickets can be purchased for individual short trips (3 euros) or a 24-hour ticket (7.60 euros), which entitles the holder to any number of trips within the area of validity. Tickets can be purchased via the Deutsche Bahn website (bahn.de/en), via the VRR and DB app, at ticket machines, at the KundenCenter Hauptbahnhof and Neue Mitte, as well as on buses and streetcars.

>>> From the Super 8 Hotel to the Lichtburg

The above mentioned connections can also be used in the opposite direction to get to the cinema. From the main train station, the Lichtburg can be reached on foot in 5 minutes.

>>> From Oberhausen main station to Hotel Zum Eisenhammer


To get to the Hotel Zum Eisenhammer you can take the bus line **976 (to Oberhausen Zum Eisenhammer)** at the stop **"OB Hbf./Rhein. Industriemuseum"** behind the main station and get off at the bus stop **"Oberhausen zum Eisenhammer".** From here it is only a few minutes walk to the hotel.

Tickets can be purchased for individual short trips (1.90 euros) or a 24-hour ticket (7.60 euros), which entitles the holder to any number of trips within the area of validity. Tickets can be purchased via the Deutsche Bahn website (bahn.de/en), via the VRR and DB app, at ticket machines, at the KundenCenter Hauptbahnhof and Neue Mitte, as well as on buses and streetcars.

>>> From Hotel Zum Eisenhammer to the Lichtburg

The above connections can also be used in the opposite direction to get to the cinema. From the stop "Oberhausen Marktstr." the Lichtburg can be reached on foot in just a few minutes.
